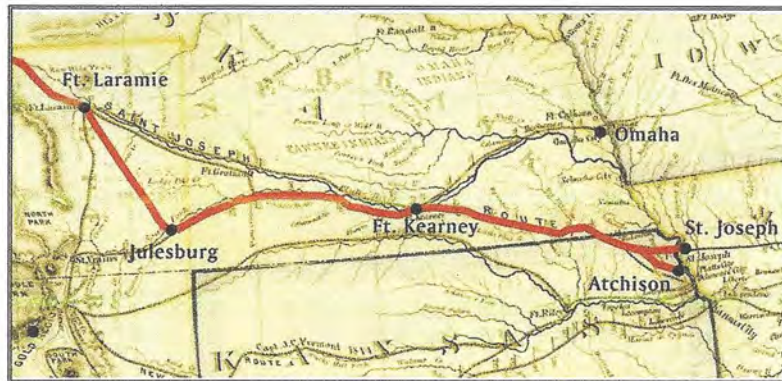

Pony Express Route via Julesburg, Kansas Territory



22nd September 1860 San Francisco to North Haverstraw, New York prepaid \$2.50

Pony Express charge for one-quarter ounce pencil note Via Pony on eastbound trip No. 33.

Arriving at St. Joseph, Missouri on October 3rd entering U. S. Mail on 3rd October 1860 at St Joseph carried by government mails to P. Van Valer, Esq. North Haverstraw, New York.

The only reported example carried on this trip.

PONY EXPRESS! Ten Days TO SAN FRANCISCO.

LETTERS will be received at the office of the **United States Express Company,** CORNER OF CLARK AND LAKE STREETS, (180 Lake and 20 Clark streets.)

Which will be forwarded to connect with the Pony Express, leaving St. Joseph, Missouri, every WEDNESDAY AND SATURDAY, AT 11 P. M.

TELEGRAMS

Sent to Fort Kearney on the mornings of Monday and Friday, will connect with the Pony, leaving St. Joseph Wednesdays and Saturdays.

EXPRESS CHARGES:

Letters weighing $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. or under 1.....\$2.00
Letters weighing over 1 oz..... 4.00
The half ounce letters will be reduced to one dollar after July 1st.

In all cases to be enclosed in Government stamped envelopes, and all Express charges prepaid.
